



CB Radios with AM and FM - Legal Information Common Radio Passport

The radio may be used in European Countries only according to following information, which we collected from the national authorities or from public available sources. We publish these information as **"Radio Passport"**. Because the number of countries allowing the AM standard is changing, it is important that you use the latest version of this radio passport (can be downloaded any time from <http://www.hobbyradio.de>). This version has been issued on Nov. 29, 2012. The CB radio complies to the latest European regulations (R&TTE directive, EN 300 433-2 and ECC DEC(11)03) and has been notified in the countries below. Channel restricted special country versions (e.g. for Austria without country switching or a Poland version with the special Poland frequencies with 5 kHz offset and 4 Watt AM) are allowed to be used in the national areas only. Please note, that not all of our radios support Poland and/or UK channels.

For travelling with your radio, we recommend to provide a copy of your home country licence document or / and this Radio Passport together with the radio. The above Radio Passport is based on public available information, while country specific requirements may change without notice during the harmonisation process in Europe.

* Here we recommend to ask local authorities about implementation of AM with 4 Watts before travelling.
